When Carrie the Musical premiered in 1988 on Broadway it was labeled a flop. It was seen as over the top and almost comedic at times, but the producers knew it was a story that needed to be shared. Refusing to give up they took a try again in 2012 but this time setting this tragic, yet beautiful story in modern day.

The story of Carrie is very real and resonates so well with many of us involved with the production.
